Margaret Barrett earned a Master's degree in Human Resources, Bachelor's in Sociology, and a Diploma in Social Work from the University of the West Indies. Margaret served commendably in the public sector in Jamaica, as Senior Probation Officer, Senior Administrator, Senior Industrial Relations Officer and Senior Personnel Officer before joining the private sector, where she was employed by Jamaica National Building Society. There she served as Personnel and Training Manager establishing the Personnel systems and policies for the Society. As Senior Manager, she was transferred to Florida to set up and manage the affairs of the newly established Representative Office. She is now retired and presently is a consultant in the life insurance industry.

Margaret's community involvement includes her role as president of the Probation and Aftercare Association in Jamaica, founding president of the Government Personnel Managers Association, deputy chairman of the Building Societies Association of Jamaica (BSAJ), and vice president of the

Jaycees of Jamaica. She has given great support to community-based associations here in Florida. Currently, Margaret is serving on the board of the University of the West Indies Alumni Association (Florida Chapter), as is the Immediate past president of the Florida Chapter.

Donat Grant, a resident of the City of Weston since 1994, graduated from UWI 1979 with a B.Sc. (Honors) degree in Pure and Applied Physics and did graduate work at Nova Southeastern University earning a Master of Science degree in Computer Information Systems. Donat is also a graduate of Excelsior High School in Jamaica. He is currently employed as a software engineer at Bluegreen Corporation.

Donat is the cofounder of Pioneer Community Church (2004); president of Missions for Health (M4H), a 501c corporation that has been offering free dental care at East Queen Street Baptist Church in Kingston, Jamaica since 2014; and director of a Summer Your Camp since 1984. He has served as the Second Vice President of South Florida's UWI Alumni, and actively supports the initiatives of the association

UWI Graduate Dr. Cecil Aird, who is internationally recognized in his field, has opened the US\$250,000.00 Carnegie Hand Institute and Surgery Centre, not only with the aim of assisting individuals who need this specialized service but also with the aim of passing on these specialist hand surgery skills to Jamaican and Caribbean doctors.

Cecil is a proud UWI Pelican, who often reminisces about his UWI days and has kept in touch with his classmates. Through his membership in the **UWI 1948 Society** (the non profit UWI Medical Alumni Foundation) he has helped to raise funds for scholarships to assist UWI Medical Students over a number of years.

He is the Executive Director of the Carnegie Hand Institute and Surgery Centre (CHISC) and has over 30 years' experience in hand treatment. The Carnegie private medical facility will offer

the identical services offered at the Tampa Bay Hand Centre in Florida, which he operated before. He named the facility in honour of one of Jamaica's top twentieth century physicians and surgeons, Dr. Alfred Carnegie.

Cecil has a philanthropic and altruistic outlook, and is working with Dr. Delroy Fray, the Senior Medical Officer at Cornwall Regional Hospital (CRH), to explore possibilities for young doctors at CRH be trained in hand surgery at the CHISC. We salute our distinguished alumnus, Dr. Cecil Aird, and thank him for the gift of movement that he has brought back to the hands of so many individuals during his career.
